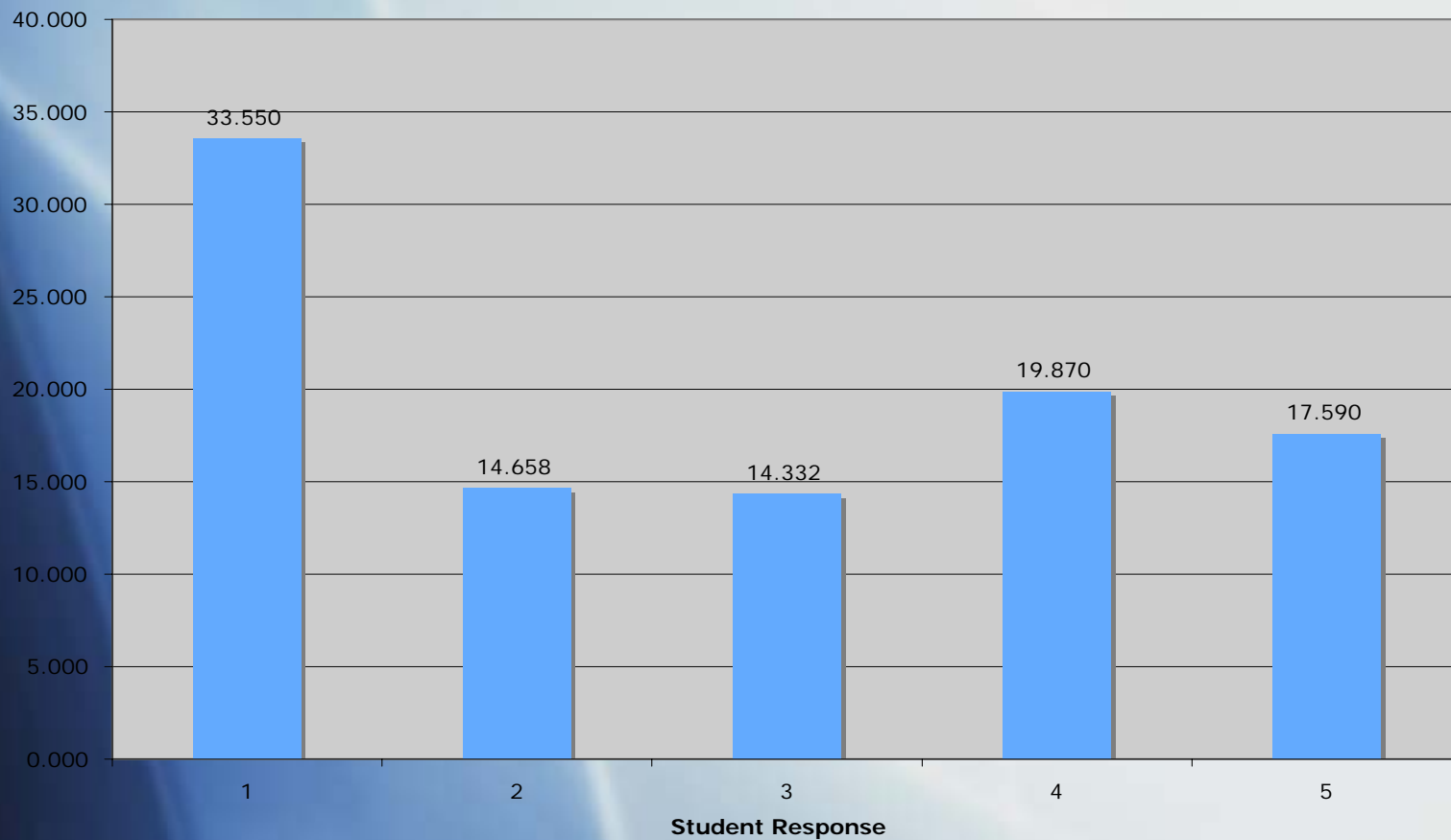

# The Survey

- 307 students (grades 9-12) completed the FCS/TE survey across all course levels (300-100).
- 148 of the students surveyed are currently taking or finished a FCS/TE course at the time of the survey.

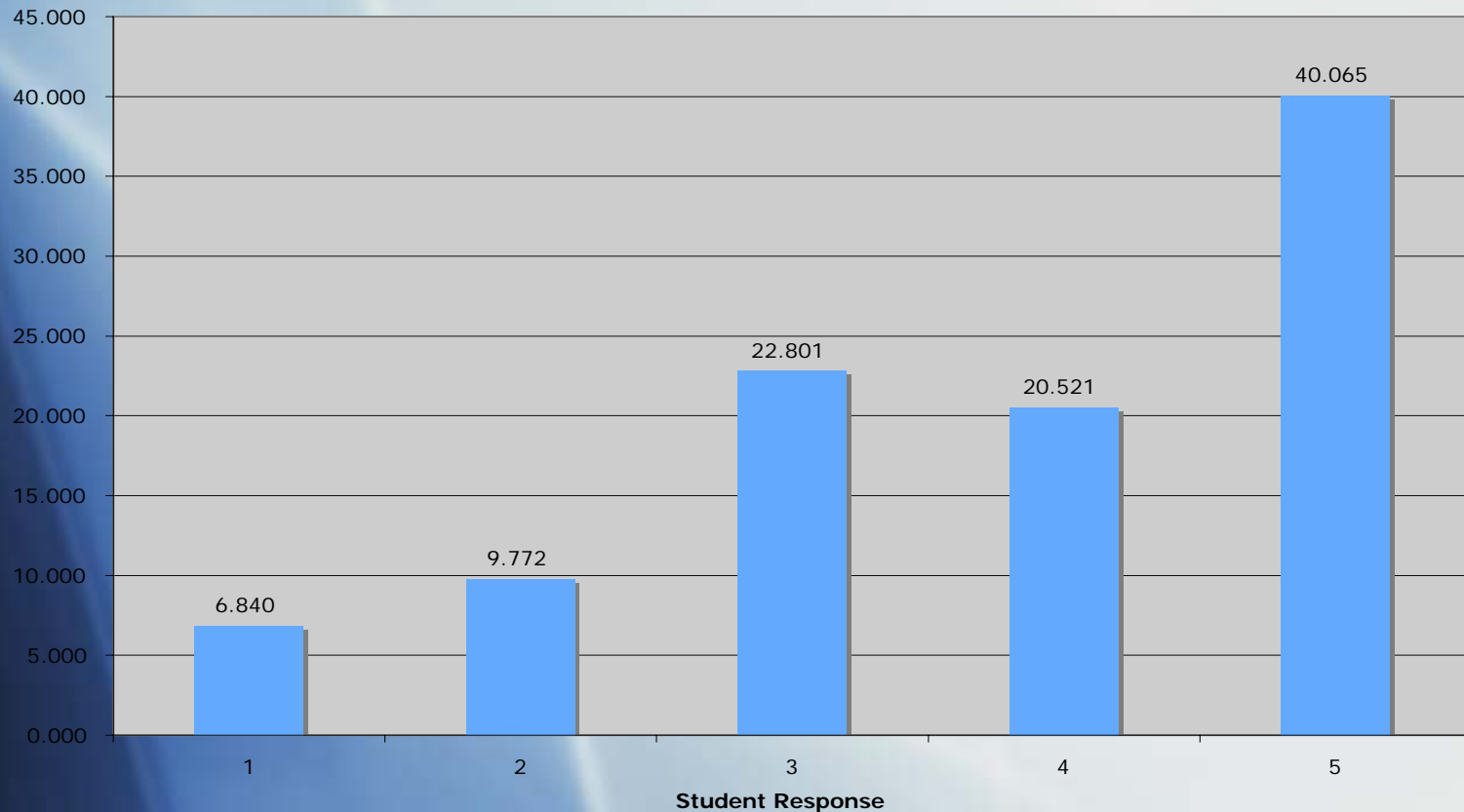
# (Q1) I would like to enroll in a Family Consumer Science and/or Technology Education course.

1 = Strongly Agree 2 = Agree 3 = NA 4 = Disagree 5 = Strongly Disagree



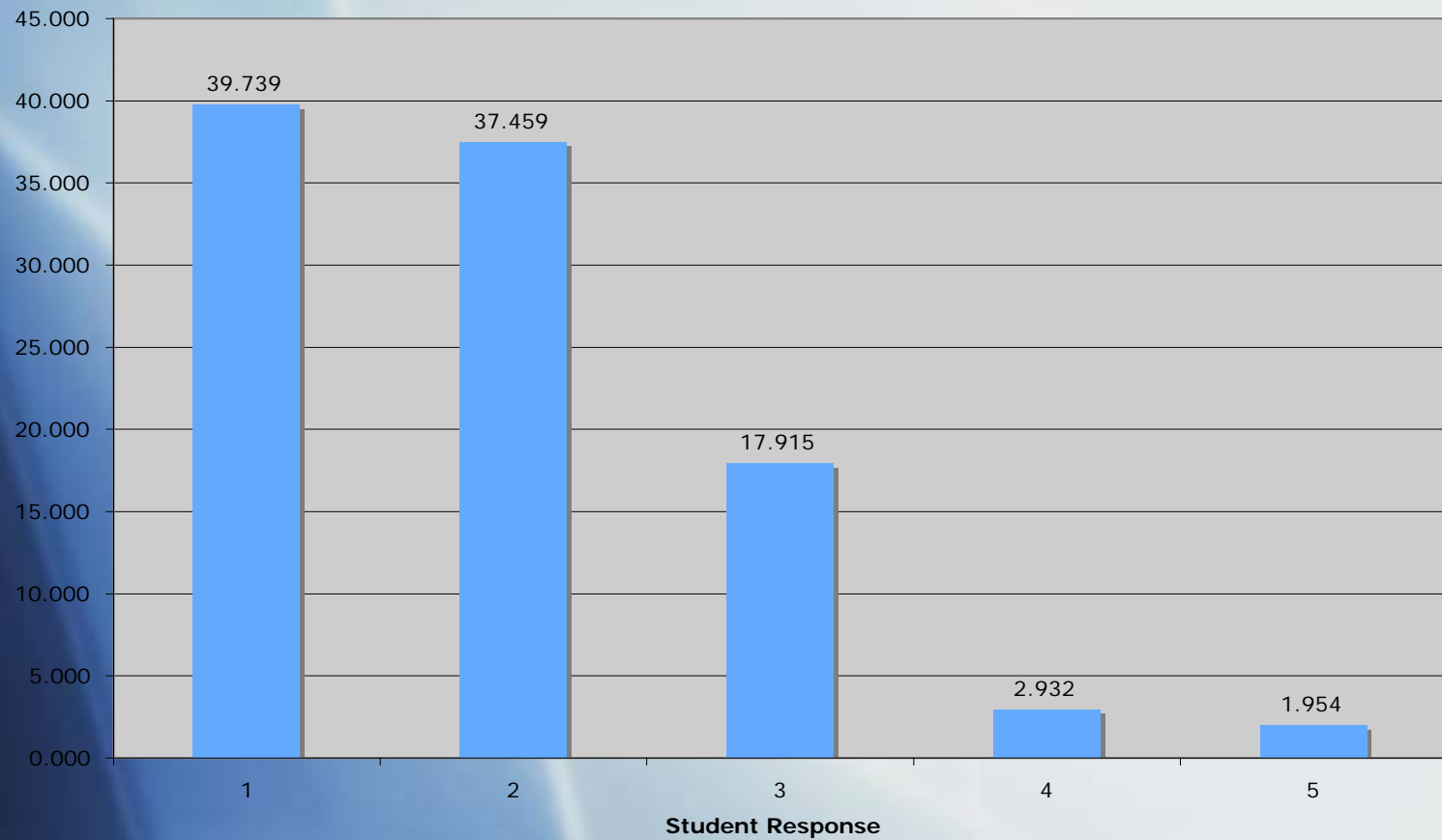
# (Q2) Family Consumer Science and Technology Education classes should be offered only at Seacoast School of Technology (S.S.T.).

1 = Strongly Agree 2 = Agree 3 = NA 4 = Disagree 5 = Strongly Disagree



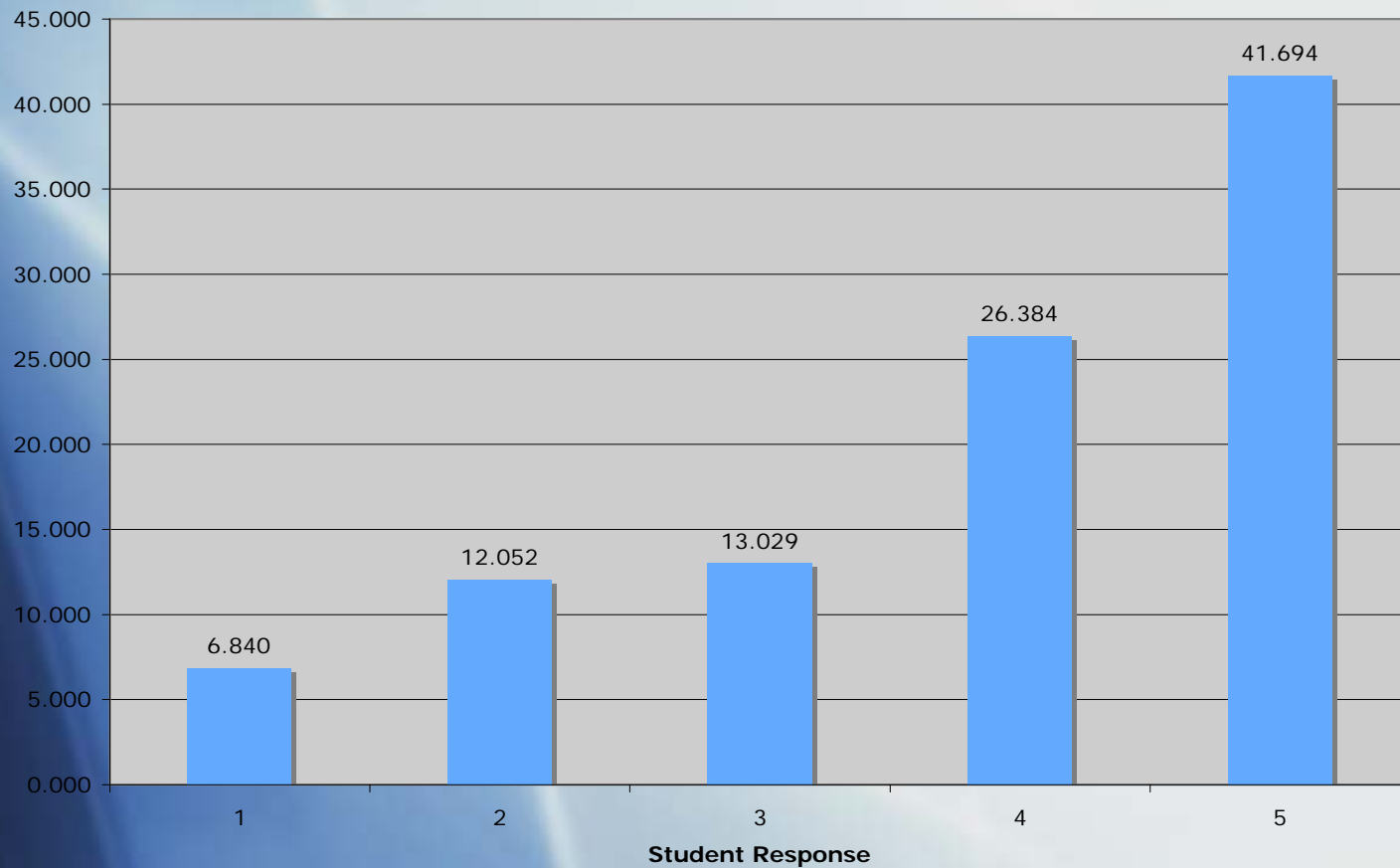
# (Q3) One period classes are easy to schedule at Exeter high school (E.H.S.).

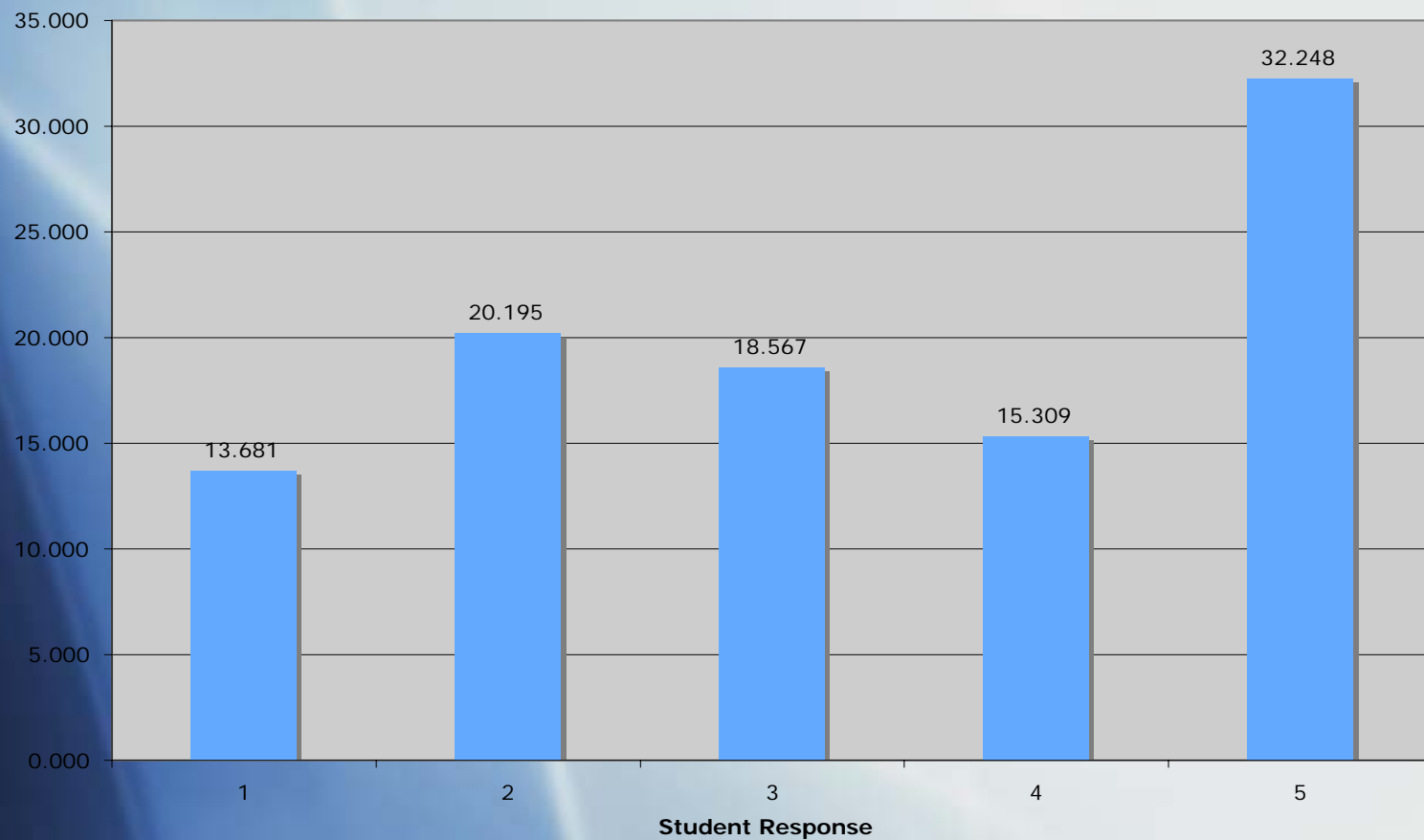
(Q4) I would choose to enroll in a double period class for Technology Education or Family Consumer Science at S.S.T.

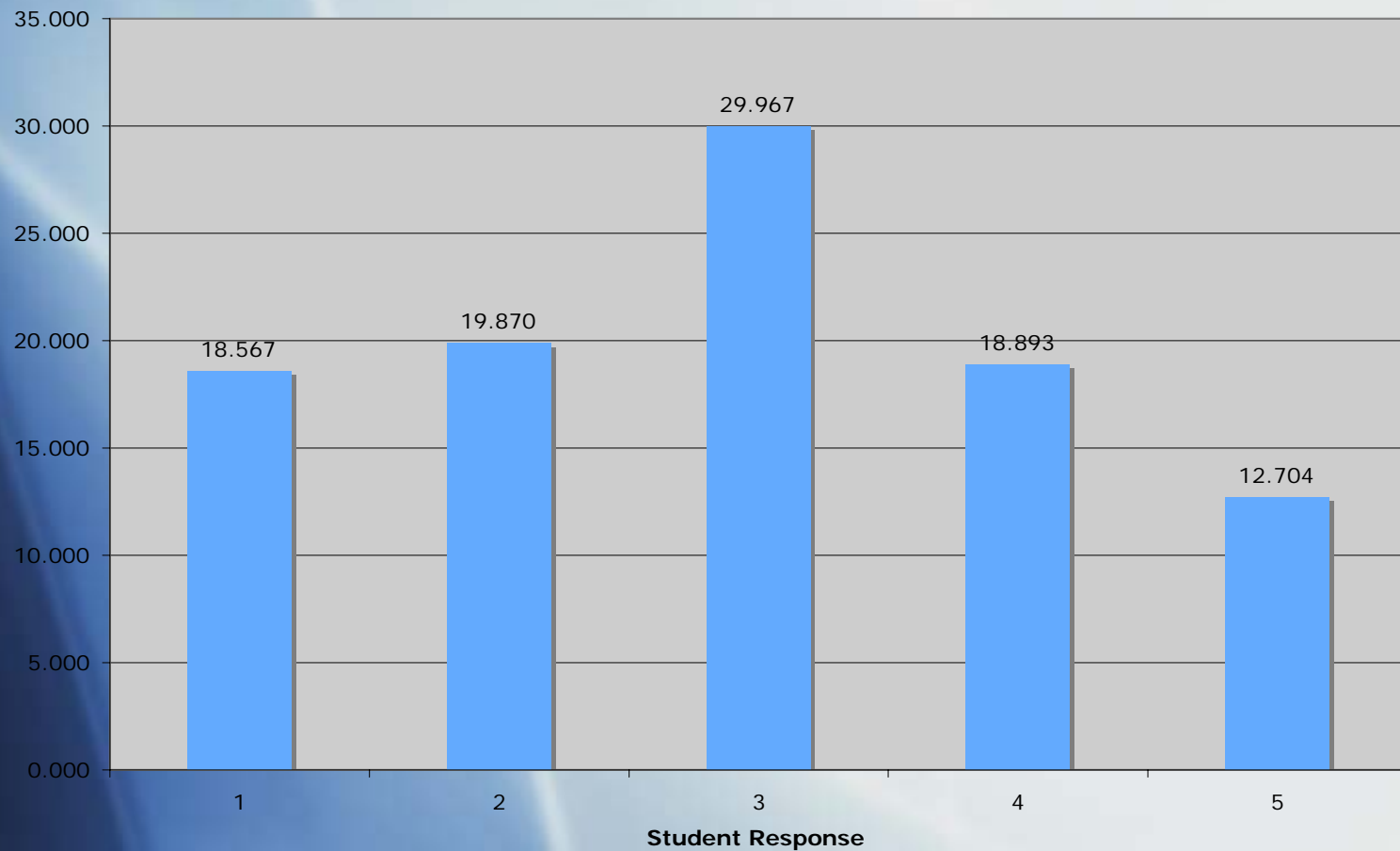
(Q5) Leaving early from a high school class to get to S.S.T. is O.K for me.

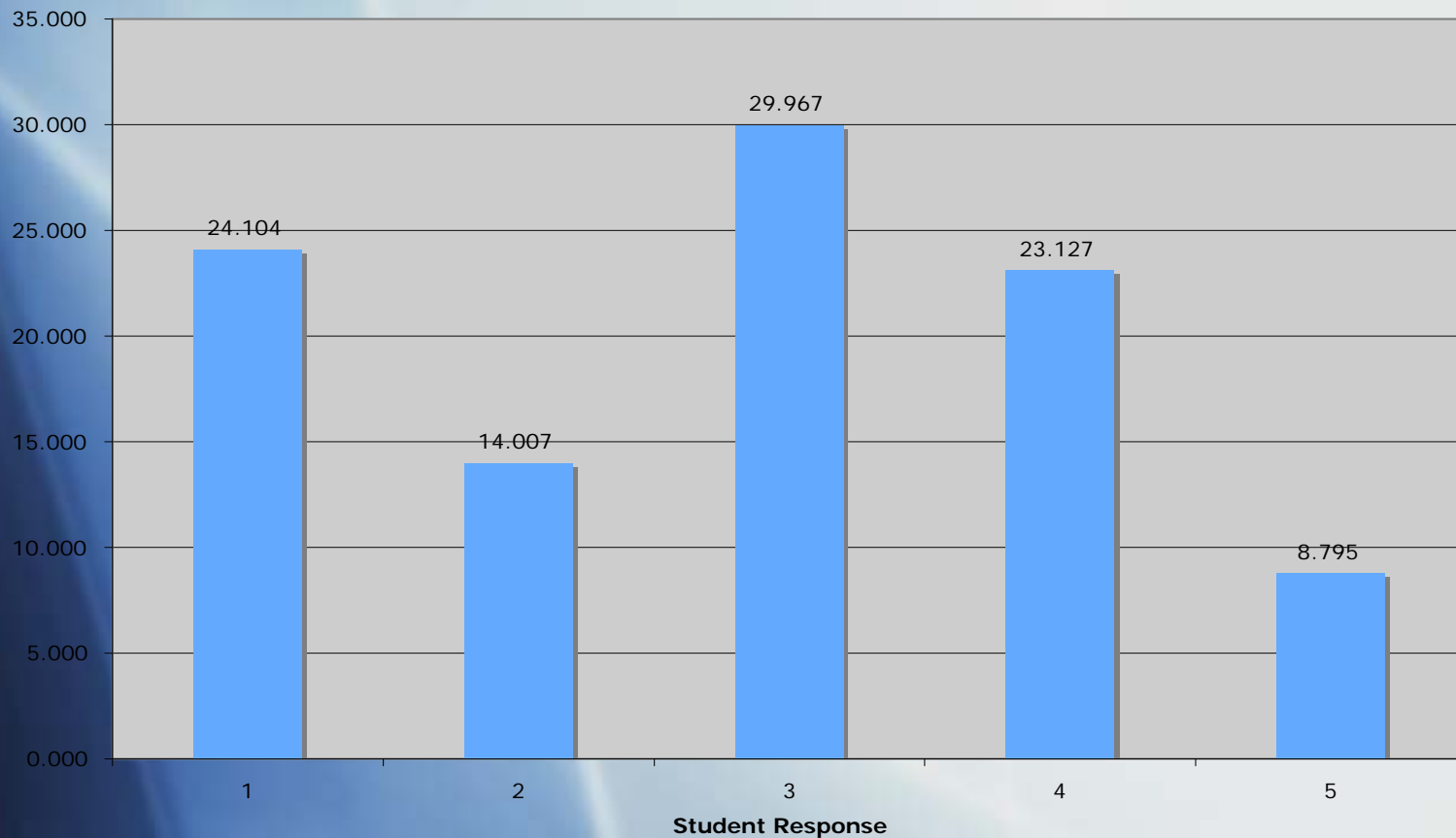
# (Q6) Double period classes are easy to schedule at E.H.S.

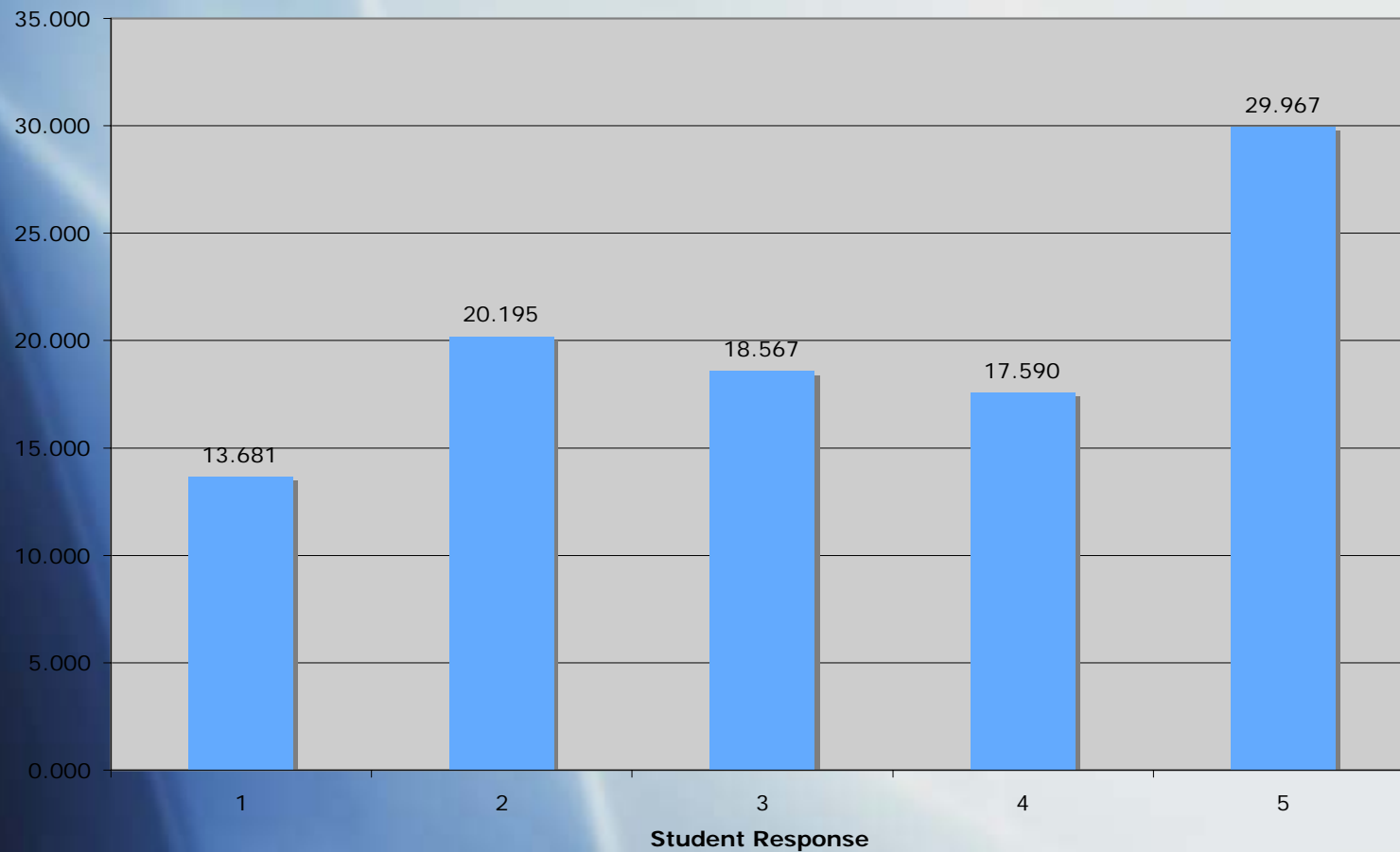
# (Q7) Family Consumer Science and Technology Education classes should be offered only at E.H.S.

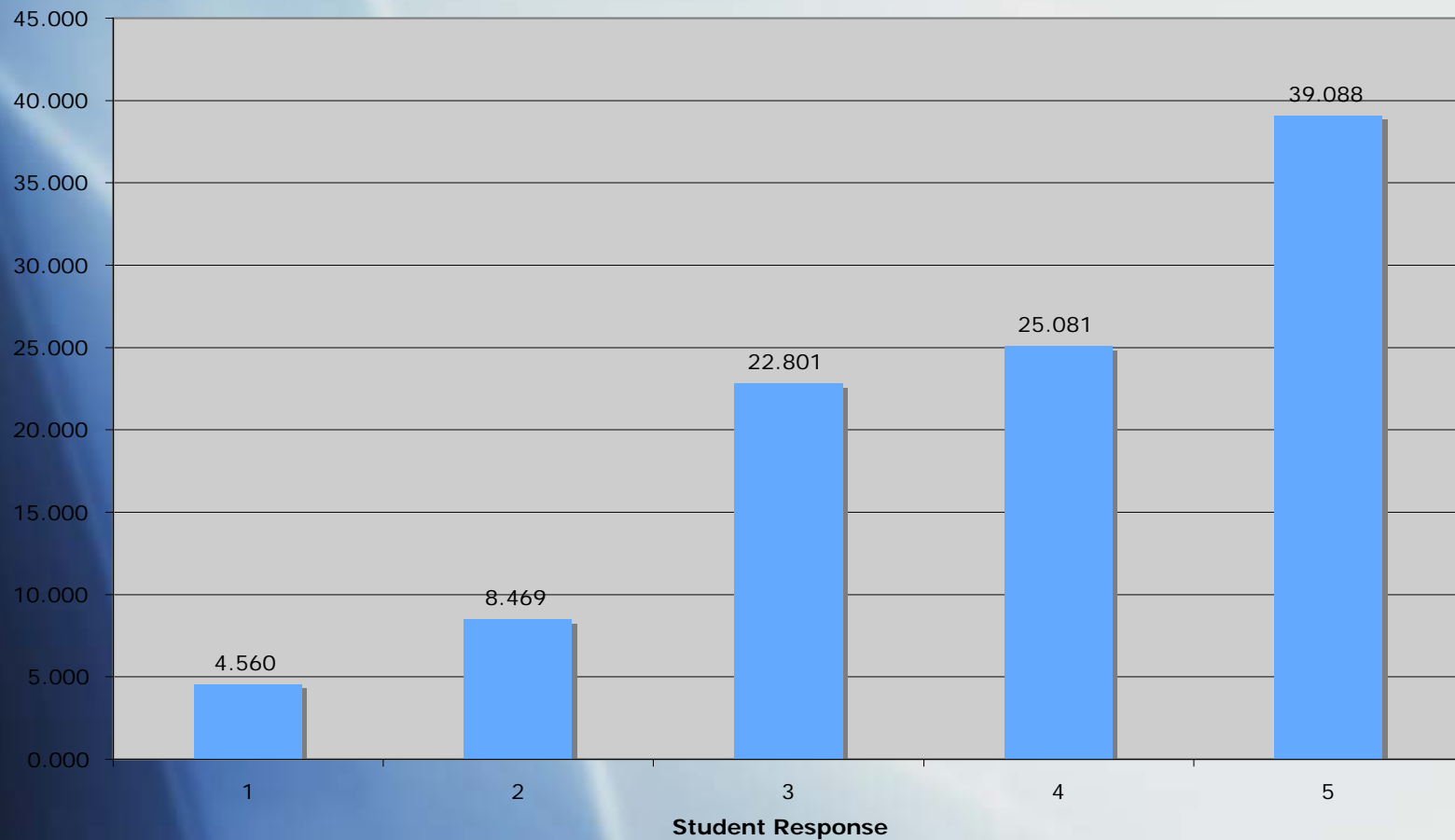
(Q8) Arriving late from SST to the next class at E.H.S is O.K for me.

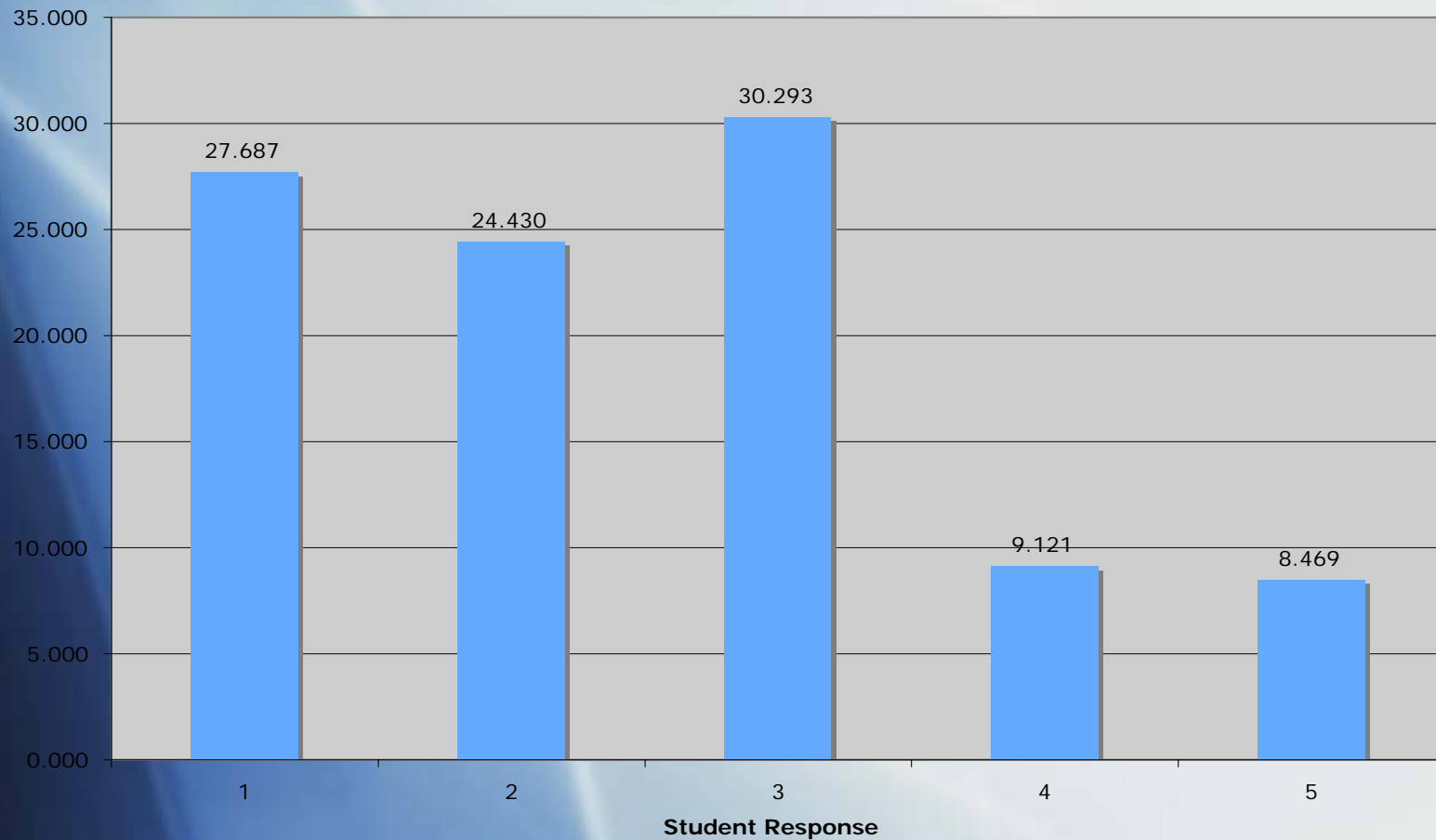
(Q9) I would like to be bused over to S.S.T. to participate in Family Consumer Science and Technology Education.

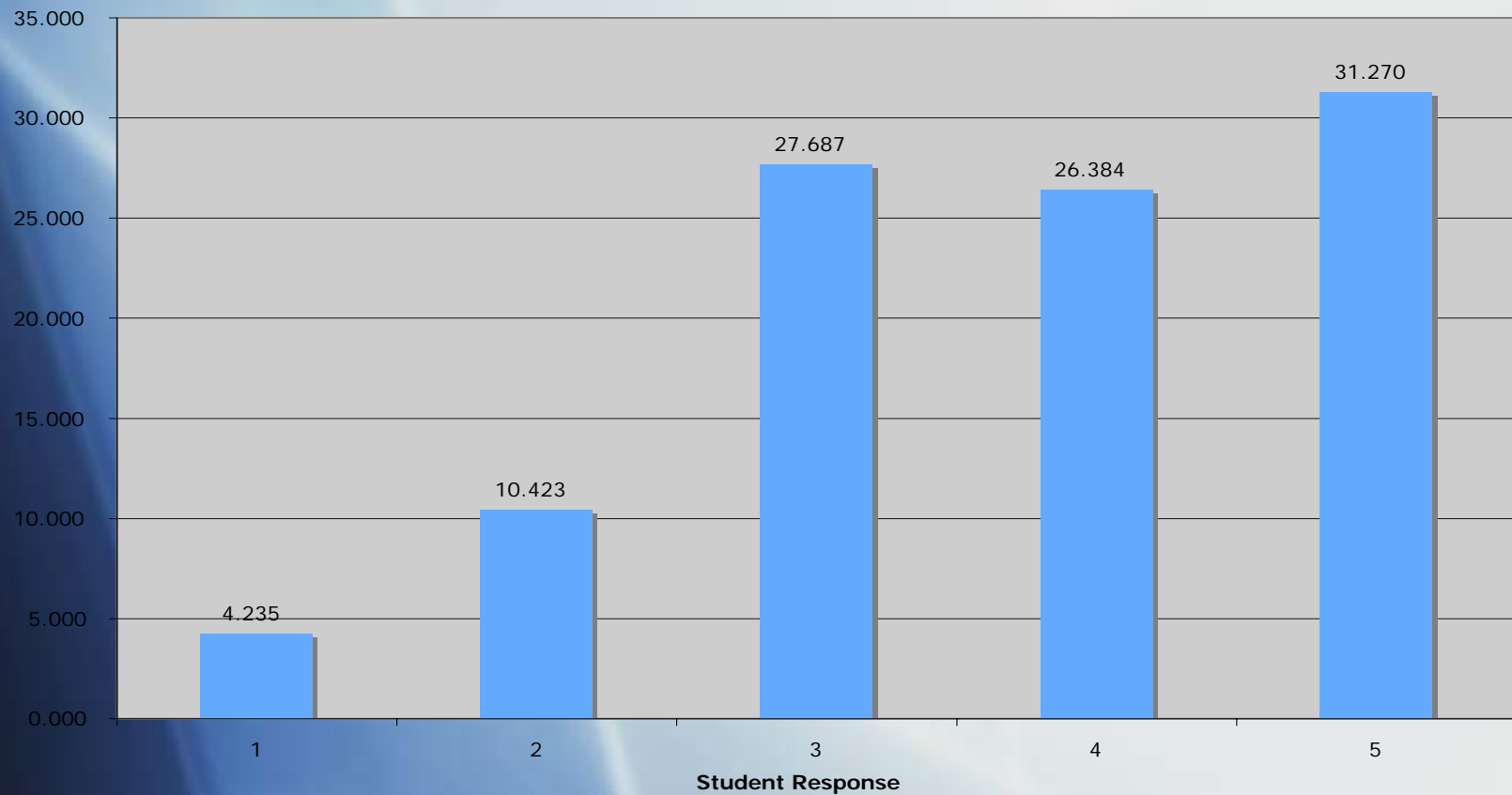
(Q10) Arriving late to the next class at E.H.S disrupts classes and sometimes my lunch.

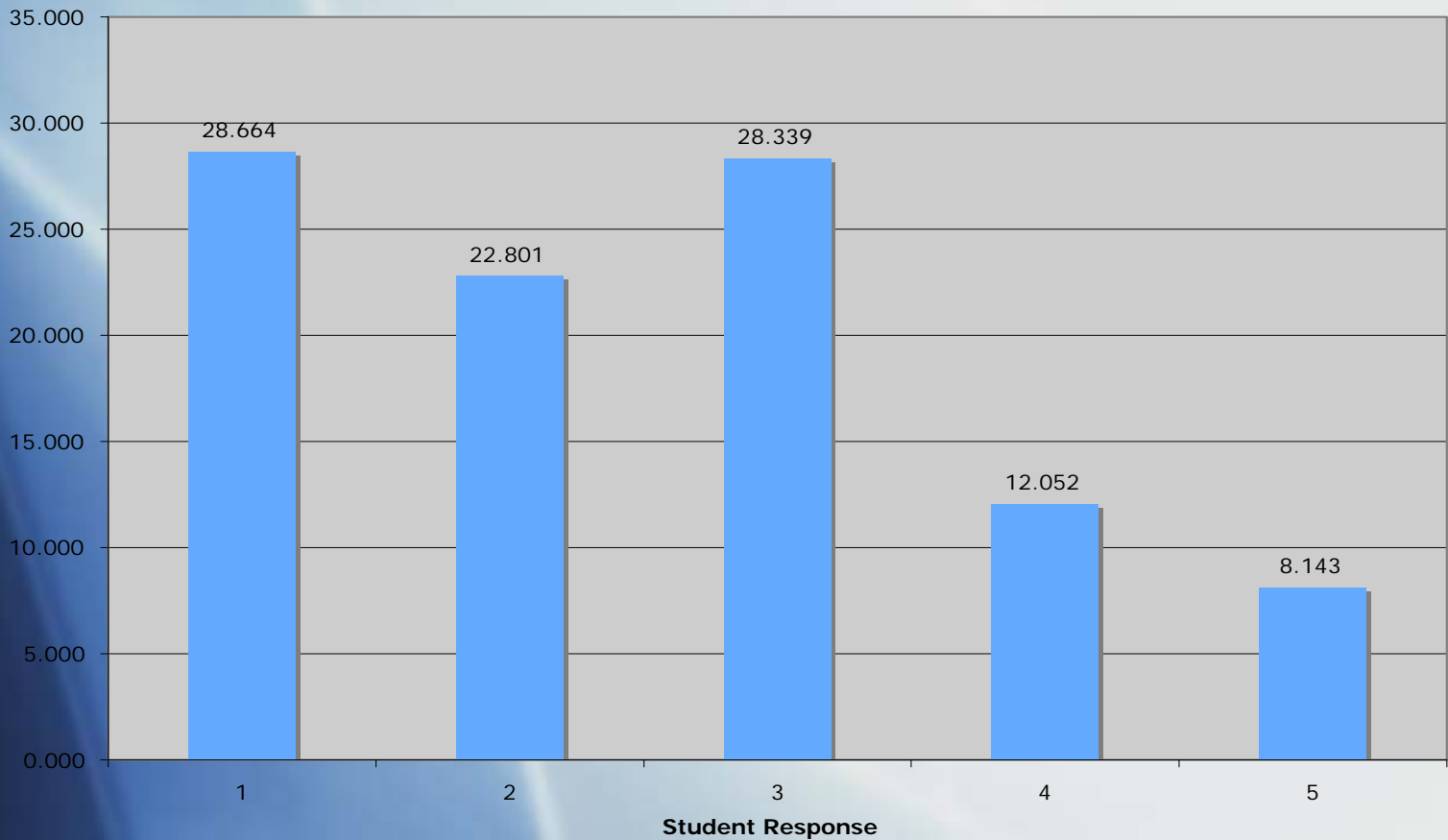
(Q11) I would choose to enroll in a single period class for Technology Education or Family Consumer Science at S.S.T.

# Results Summary

- 60 % of the students surveyed disagreed/strongly disagreed that Family Consumer Science and Technology Education classes should be offered only at Seacoast School of Technology (S.S.T.).
- 51% (SA/A) of the students surveyed felt that arriving late from SST disrupts classes and sometimes their lunch.
- 50% (SA/A) of the students surveyed felt that leaving early from EHS disrupts classes and sometimes their lunch.
- 64 % of the students surveyed disagreed/strongly disagreed to be bused over to SST for FCS/TE classes.

# Results Summary

- 57% of the students surveyed disagree/strongly disagree in choosing to enroll in a single period class for Technology Education or Family Consumer Science at S.S.T.
- 76% (SA/A) of the students surveyed felt single period classes are easier to schedule than double period classes at EHS.
- 67% of the students surveyed disagree/strongly disagree in choosing in a double period class for Technology Education or Family Consumer Science at S.S.T.
